Introduction

The IEU Library offers access to a diverse range of academic and professional resources, designed to support study, research, and teaching across **Computer Science, Data Science, Artificial Intelligence, Engineering, Mathematics, Sustainability, and Biotechnology**. Through the Library portal, the university community can consult **specialized databases**, explore the **Premium Press** collection for high-quality news and analysis, and access the High Interest Journal List, which brings together the most relevant scholarly publications in these fields.

In addition, the **Library Catalog** offers a comprehensive collection of books, eBooks, and other materials across various disciplines, ensuring coverage of both classic and contemporary scholarship. These resources are complemented by tools and guides that help users navigate information efficiently, making it easier to find reliable, updated, and relevant content.

Together, these services ensure that students, faculty, and staff can strengthen their academic work, stay informed about developments in national and international law, and deepen their understanding of key issues in legislation, jurisprudence, legal theory, and policy.

Core Services

Interlibrary Loan

The **Interlibrary Loan (ILL)** service enables IE University students, faculty, and staff to **access books, articles, and other resources not available in the IEU Library collection** by borrowing them from partner libraries worldwide. How it works:

1. Search first: Check the Library Catalog. If the item isn't available, complete the ILL online request form.
2. Provide details: Add the bibliographic information (title, ISBN, DOI, etc.). For printed books, choose your pickup location.
3. Receive your material: Items usually arrive within 10 days. Please note that ILL items are personal and non-transferable.

DiY IEU Library App

The **DiY IEU Library App** allows you to manage your library activity anytime and anywhere. What you can do:

- Borrow, renew, or return items: Check your loans and due dates, or renew materials directly from your phone.
- Place holds: Request or cancel holds, and receive notifications when items are ready for pickup.



01 Catalog

The IEU Library Catalog, powered by WorldCat Discovery, is the main search tool for finding academic resources. Searching in the Catalog offers several advantages:

- **Single search point:** books, eBooks, journals, articles, and other resources can be located in one place.
- **Beyond IE holdings:** if an item is not available at IEU Library, you can see which other libraries worldwide hold it.
- **Multilingual records:** materials are indexed in nearly 500 languages, including English, Spanish, French, German, and Chinese.
- **Interlibrary loan:** items that are not in our collection can often be requested from partner libraries.
- **Up to date:** records are continuously added, making new publications quickly discoverable.

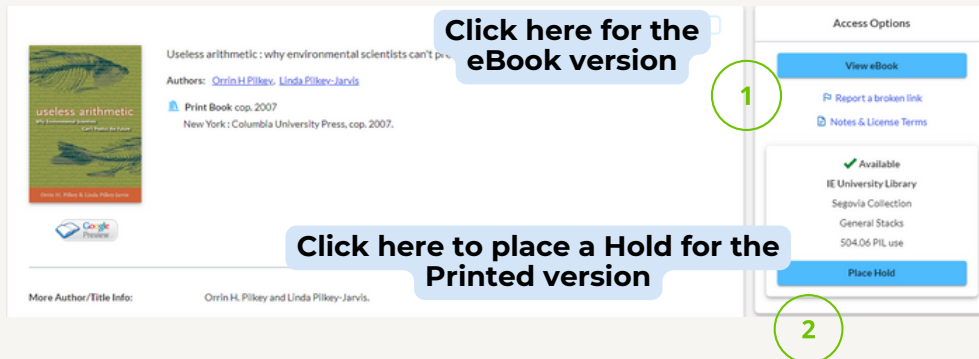

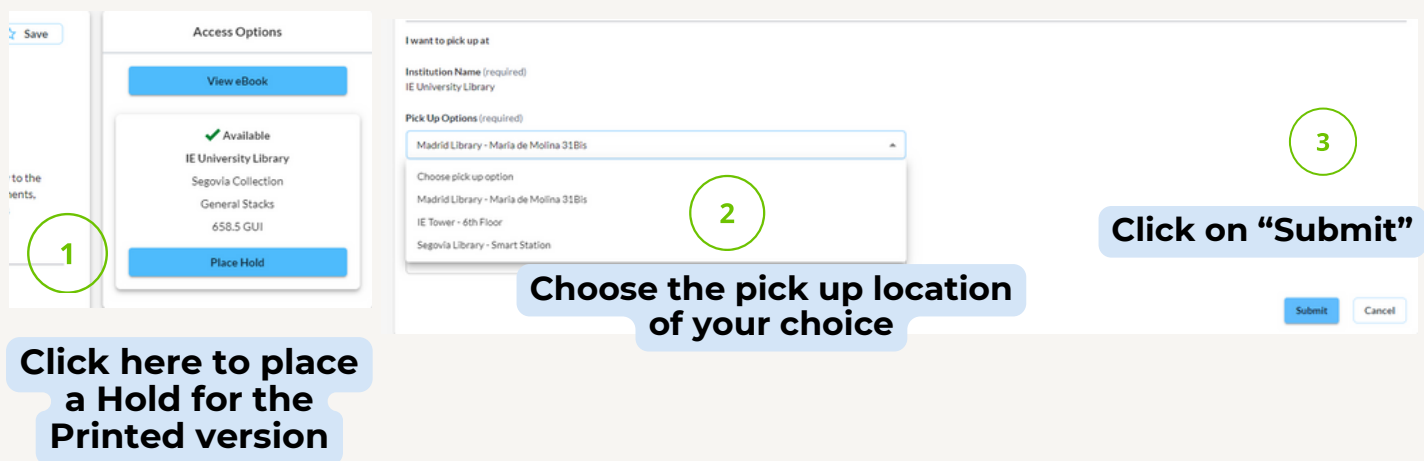


eBooks

The IEU Library's eBook collections **allow users to read online or download content for offline access**. You can usually download individual chapters in PDF format, or, if you prefer to download the entire book, you will need to install Adobe Digital Editions. This free application enables you to read eBooks on your device.

Just so you know, licenses vary between publishers, which means that some eBooks may only be available for a limited loan period. After that time, the file will automatically expire and disappear from your device; however, you can always download it again whenever you need it.


Printed books



- Stand-alone titles including *The New York Times*, *Financial Times*, *The Economist*, or *Washington Post*, among others.

03 e-Databases & Resources



In this section, we will highlight some of the most relevant databases for Computer Science, Data Science, Artificial Intelligence, Engineering, Mathematics, Sustainability, and Biotechnology. These resources provide access to academic research, company data, market reports, statistics, and more.

These databases are here to support you, whether you are a student, a professor, or staff. They provide access to reliable academic resources, real-world data, and the latest news.

Multidisciplinary Scientific Research

- **ScienceDirect:** journals and eBooks covering computer science, engineering, mathematics, environmental science, and life sciences.
- **Springer Journals:** thousands of peer-reviewed journals in STEM fields, including sustainability and technology.
- **Nature Portfolio:** leading journals in science and technology, including Nature, Nature Sustainability, and Nature Communications.
- **Scopus:** multidisciplinary abstract and citation database for tracking research, authors, and institutional output.
- **Web of Science:** citation index providing access to core scientific and technical journals.

Data, Policy & Innovation

- **OECD iLibrary:** statistics and reports on science, technology, innovation, and sustainability.
- **Statista:** statistics and market data on technology sectors, digital innovation, and industries.

Information & Technology Management

- **LISTA (Library, Information Science & Technology Abstracts):** indexes journals on information management, data systems, digital transformation, and emerging technologies.

04 High Interest Journals List

The High Interest Journal List offers direct access to a curated selection of leading academic journals relevant to computer science, data analytics or technology. These publications are recognized for their scholarly impact and reliability, and serve as a key reference point for anyone seeking rigorous research and analysis on global issues. Together with the Library's databases, Premium Press collection, and Catalog, the list offers another entry point to high-quality academic content.

05 Research



In addition to subject-specific databases, the IEU Library provides access to multidisciplinary research tools such as **Web of Science**, **Scopus**, **OpenAlex**, or **BASE**. These platforms allow you to search across millions of academic publications, track citations, and identify the most relevant research in science, technology, engineering, mathematics, and related disciplines.

Here are some practical tips to make the most of them:

1

Use broad keywords first, then refine:

begin with a general concept (e.g. machine learning, renewable energy, or biotechnology) and then use filters to narrow results by date, country, or subject.

2

Explore subject filters

In Scopus and Web of Science you can limit searches to data analytics, or engineering to focus only on relevant fields.

3

Check who is citing who

Follow how articles are cited to identify key authors and debates (e.g. science, technology, engineering, mathematics).

4


Find reliable journals

These platforms help you check whether a journal is indexed, its reputation, and its relevance in your discipline before submitting work.

5

Stay up to date

Create alerts for topics like sustainability in business, AI in marketing, or media strategies to receive notifications of the latest publications.



By applying these strategies, you can make your searches more efficient and ensure you are using high-quality academic sources when working on assignments, theses, or research projects.

How to Cite

Accurate citation is essential to maintain academic integrity and give proper credit to original authors. Bibliographic managers are tools that help you collect, organise, and cite references efficiently. They allow you to import records from catalogs or databases and create bibliographies in styles such as APA, MLA, or Chicago. The IEU Library supports **three main reference managers**:

- **EndNote Online Classic**: cloud-based software to collect, organize, and manage references. It also imports records directly from WorldCat.
- **Mendeley**: manages bibliographies, adds in-text citations, and allows collaboration among researchers. Available online and as a desktop app.
- **Zotero**: open-source tool to collect and organize sources, available for web or desktop use, with additional features like ZoteroBib for quick citation creation.

IE Repository

IE repository is an **open access platform that collects, manages, and preserves the academic and research output** of our university and our users (researchers, professors and staff). This Repository aims to enhance the visibility and impact of our research community while fulfilling open access mandates from funding agencies and institutional policies.

06 Trainings



The IEU Library offers a comprehensive Training Portal designed to help students, faculty, and staff make the most of all available resources. Through a combination of synchronous and asynchronous materials, the portal **provides access to guides, tutorials, videos, webinars, and live training sessions that enhance your knowledge**, maximise your research, and enrich your studies.

The portal is organised into five main sections — **Library Services, Academic Support, Research Support, Online Press, and Specialised Databases** — which structure a learning path for developing academic and professional skills. Within these routes, you can discover reliable and relevant content tailored to improve your learning and research experience.

The library offers training sessions for students, faculty, and staff on its resources and services, including support for undergraduate and master's theses, syllabus development, subject-specific resources, and sessions specially tailored to the **Science & Technology School**.
